## GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

The CB&Q Railroad will use the I.B.M. punch card system in the reporting of the movement, records and accounting of freight cars both loaded and empty.

1. The Teletype Operators in reporting car information and sending train consists must exercise care in printing sequence and spacing so as to coincide with the punching of the car record cards. The use of dittos and special characters must be discontinued, coding and abbreviations must conform to instructions.

2. All personnel must exercise care to obtain proper and correct information from the waybills, slips and check forms so this information will reach the various yards and offices prior to the arrival of such trains.

3. Coding and abbreviations of various information such as commodities, destination, junction points, city, state and other information will be standardized system wide and with other roads.

4. The **1645 revised form** should be completed with all necessary information and written in legible form to reduce chances for mistakes.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR TELETYPE OPERATORS

1. Teletype all train consists according to "Train Consist Guide".
2. Limit unnecessary characters from the tape, repeatedly striking Ltrs. or Figs. keys should be discontinued.
3. The carriage return key should be punched two (2) times for end of line.
4. When mistakes occurs on direct keyboard, punch Figs., upper case D - \$ sign, then proceed to next line and correct error.
5. When mistake occurs with perforator, proceed to clear tape in normal manner.
6. Discontinue Ltrs. punch at start of each line on numbered consists.
7. Any corrections on train consists to be followed by the Dollar (\$) 2 Carriage Returns and I Line Feed. Such as;

2. Standard Refrigeration with Ventilation
  - Reice all Regular Icing Stations
  - Use Standard Refrigeration code  
and appropriate ventilation code.
  - Example :
    - Standard Refrigeration, Diagonal SRDV45
    - Vents at 45 degrees.
  
3. Modified Refrigeration (under Sec. 200)
  - Show Rule number and % salt if any R247S2
  
4. Meat, PHP, Dairy Products Under Refrigeration (Under Sec. 400)
  - Reice All Regular Icing Stations RAR
  - Reice All Regular Icing Stations :
    - Block Ice RARBL
    - Coarse Ice RARC
    - Crushed Ice RARF
  - Show designated percentage of salt  
end of all coding.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING OUT WHEEL REPORTS BY CONDUCTORS

1. When Wheel Report is prepared late in the day and the actual departure of the train is after midnight, the Conductor will correct the Wheel Report to show actual date.
2. Complete information should be shown for all cars picked up and set out in route.
